EXERCISE FOLLOW UP

Battery Maintenance

If you have a lead acid battery, you should follow the procedures stated here to get the most life out of your battery. If you have a maintenance free battery there is no electrolyte level to check but you should keep the cables and connectors clean.

Perform Monthly Maintenance

A battery only requires a little monthly maintenance to perform perfectly. Keep the battery charged to 100%, recharging when the lights dim, the starter sounds weak, or the battery hasn't been used in more than two weeks. Other than that, follow this simple check list every month:

- Check the electrolyte level
- Keep the top free of grime
- Check cables, clamps, and case for obvious damage or loose connections
- Clean terminals and connectors as necessary
- Check inside for excessive sediment, sulfation or mousing
- Make sure the exhaust tube is free of kinks and clogs
- Replace caps firmly

Finish up by testing the battery with either a hydrometer or voltmeter. To extend the service life of your battery, make monthly battery maintenance part of your routine.

Storing Your Battery

If the vehicle is in storage or used infrequently, disconnect the battery cable to eliminate drain from electrical equipment. Charge the battery every two weeks.

For extended storage, remove the battery from the vehicle and charge to 100%. Charge the battery every month if stored at temperatures below 60° F. If stored in a warm area (above 60° F), charge every two weeks. Make sure batteries are stored out of reach of children.

If you are not going to take the battery out of your bike or you do not ride it very infrequently, a trickle charger is recommended to keep the battery at full charge.

A good trickle charger is meant to maintain the charge in your battery. It is not meant and will not fully charge a run down battery. Trickle chargers are meant to maintain the battery charge when the bikes charging system is not in operation. There are several good trickle chargers that you can purchase. They will only supply 2.5 amps of power to maintain the battery and will not over charge the battery, in other words it will supply a charge on demand only when the battery charge falls below a certain level.

If your battery is discharged to low, you will need a higher capacity battery charger to recharge you battery to the proper level.

Remember that even if your bike is turned off, there is still an electrical drain

Jury Duty Scam !

This has been verified by the FBI (their link is also included below). Please pass this on to everyone in your email address book. It is spreading fast so be prepared should you get this call. Most of us take those summonses for jury duty seriously, but enough people skip out on their civic duty, that a new and ominous kind of fraud has surfaced.

The caller claims to be a jury coordinator. If you protest that you never received a summons for jury duty, the scammer asks you for your Social Security number and date of birth so he or she can verify the information and cancel the arrest warrant. Give out any of this information and bigo; your identity was just stolen.

The fraud has been reported so far in 11 states, including Oklahoma , Illinois , and Colorado . This (swindle) is particularly insidious because they use intimidation over the phone to try to bully people into giving information by pretending they are with the court system. The FBI and the federal court system have issued nationwide alerts on their web sites, warning consumers about the fraud.
