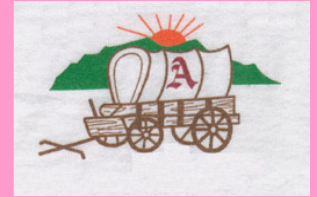

We both have grown children; Bill has two sons, and one grandson. Nancy has two sons and one wonderful daughter-in-law.

Over the years we have held all Chapter positions in WA-V. We also participate with Chapter WA-A on the West side. After we moved to the East side it was WA-M, L and S. We were on the Washington District Staff as Stores, for four years before moving to Tucson.

## Educator's Kick Start

ICE, ICE Baby....

Sorry to disappoint, but this isn't about Vanilla Ice getting older and taking up motorcycle touring on a Gold Wing, it's much more serious than that. This article is about I.C.E. In case of emergency, we've all heard about it, talked about it, nodded our heads in agreement with it, but have we really done anything about it?

Saturday, April 10, 2007 Steve Hallenbeck and I have decided to take a ride while our co-riders respectfully make Easter preparations. Intentions are a leisurely ride up South Mountain Park and lunch at an all-time favorite burger joint near ASU.

We depart from Estrella Mountain Park, destination South Mountain via roads less traveled. Transitioning from Southern Avenue to 91<sup>st</sup> Avenue, we pass a group of bicyclists headed in the opposite direction and stopped alongside the road.

In passing we assumed the riders were attending to a tire repair, but both Steve and I saw the real culprit, rider down and in need of attention. Immediately and simultaneously, we changed course to see if our first aid kits and training could be of assistance.

Approaching the scene it was obvious that this incident/accident was much more serious than expected. The cyclist known only as "Bob" had been the riding in the last position of the formation heading south and was the victim of a head on hit and run by a vehicle traveling northbound and attempting to pass slower vehicles in a "no passing zone".

Bob's injuries were serious, critical in fact. His elbow bone was fully exposed due to a deep laceration, his leg was obviously broken, and he was struggling to breathe and semi conscience. Everyone did what they could to stabilize Bob while awaiting the professionals.

The group of riders departed from West Sun City and had only met Bob earlier that morning as they formed an impromptu riding group for the day's outing. Even though Bob had his cell

phone with him, multiple attempts to contact someone who knew him were unsuccessful as we awaited emergency assistance.

When emergency personnel arrived, Bob became John Doe to everyone on the scene, paramedics, fire fighters, sheriff department and life flight crew, and Bob was in very critical condition!

The medical response team was obviously concerned and frustrated by the lack of identification, medical history and ability to speak with anyone who knew anything about Bob. Additionally, all of the other riders/witnesses within the group had little or no identification on their persons.

The Sheriff's officer on scene asked the other riders to put themselves in his or Bob's shoes and to think about the emergency responders, themselves, and others whose lives are affected by this unfortunate situation. A real awakening for all of these cyclists, and Steve and I shared our emergency cards, flash drives and I.C.E. education with the riders and officer.

Believe me, it can happen to you. I hope and pray that it won't, but don't let that stop you from preparing for the worst and sharing your preparation with others who put themselves at risk in their pursuits.

While we don't know the outcome of Bob's accident, we do know that the sixteen-year-old driver responsible for Bob's condition has been apprehended, and at that time Bob was still in critical condition at St. Joseph's hospital.

Another sure thing is that Bob's road to recovery will be long and difficult. Please ride safely, stay alert, be prepared, and take the time to put I.C.E. numbers in your cell phone and make sure you carry your emergency information cards in the left hand fairing compartment.

Safety is for life, and accidents happen in an instant. Don't get caught wishing that you had prepared!
