Chapter Educator's Corner

HELMETS

How often do you get in a discussion about the value of wearing a helmet with some that does not want hear your side of the story especially if the first thing that you say is "it will save your life".

I have a different technique that helps me get their a attention. First of all I say that very few of us need a help for that reason. Next is that the insulation in that helmet is the same that is in a cooler that keeps your favorite beverage hot or cold depending on what you are going to drink.

The helmet keeps my head warm on cold days and cooler on the hot days. Just stand out in the sun without anything on your head for a few minutes when it is really hot, then put you helmet on if that is the only head covering that you have available. Notice the difference. Next when it is really cold you lose heat from your head the quickest so keep it warm. It will help keep the rest of your body warm.

Also how many times have you had something hard hit your helmet? How would that feel without a helmet on. Next a good full face helmet will protect you from hard rain drops,hail, blowing dirt and other debris that you are likely to encounter. For those of you that wear contact lenses or need eye drops to keep your eyes moist, a full face helmet will help keep your eyes from drying out fast.

For those riders that have radio equipment, they hold those items in place for easy use. .

The last thing that you may need the helmet for, an accident. Any accident that you might have does not have to be one that involves much speed. Just falling over on a parking lot can cause severe injury. So what kind of helmet do you need? That is your choice. The best head protection is a full face, DOT, or Snell approved. How much of your head and face that you want to protect is up to you. Also whether or not you have to wear a helmet is up to what the local laws require you to wear.

We are not the helmet police but we have our opinions.

Tips and Tricks!

This month is: Sorting columns MS Excel

(Plus a special note about the new MS Word 2007 product)

Every so often, Bill Gates and his Microsoft teams like to shake stuff up. Let's see, he gave us Windows 2000 when everyone was just getting used to (and had the software for) Windows 97. He gave us VISTA, another exciting "shake-up". Now, Microsoft has come out with a new Office package that on the surface is just like the old Office applications but WAIT – it produces documents that cannot be read by any older MS Office application. Hmm, OK so the answer is that he also had to put out a CONVERTER application because hey – as much as he just cannot believe it, not everyone will be buying this new MS Office 2007 in the next week or so. Who knew?

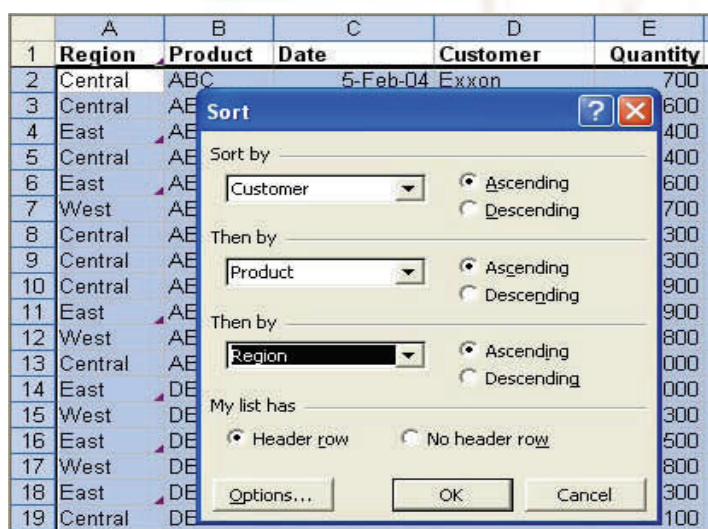
If you are receiving MS Word document files and they end in .DOCX you will not be able to read this file with your current MS Word 2000 or 2003. You must use a converter program. If you go on line and go a GOOGLE search for "MS WORD CONVERTER" the first link it brings back will take you directly to the Microsoft website and you can download the file very easily. There are also online converter programs for those of us that do not have MS Word at all. Search around and find the most appropriate help for you.

Now – let's talk about those great MS Excel spreadsheets that we sometimes get. If you receive a spreadsheet that is sorted by "customer name" and you wanted to actually see what products a customer has in a particular region. That is really three (3) sorts in one and is very easy to do.

1. Look at the upper left corner of the spreadsheet for a cell that is between the column heading A and the row number 1 - click on the cell – the spreadsheet should become highlighted.

2. Go to the menu bar along the top of the screen and click on the word DATA

Click on SORT and you will see the following dialog box



4. Make sure you select "HEADER ROW" then pick the columns you wish to sort by.

Click on OK

Your spreadsheet should now be sorted as you expected to see it. Play around and remember to only save once you have the document as you want it. You can always exit with-out saving to takeaway any changes you have made.


