POINTS TO PONDER ABOUT WATER

How much water is enough on these hot days.

We should consume about two quarts of water everyday but that doesn't mean that you need to drink it. Much of the food that we eat contains water. For instance white bread contains about 30 percent water.

Some people decided that coffee, tea, and soft drinks don't count. In large, pharmacological doses, caffeine is a diuretic but in the relatively small doses in our beverages it is not a major diuretic. Peoples systems vary so make your own decisions. People have heard that once you become thirsty you become seriously dehydrated.

The first line of defense is the anti diuretic hormone. The moment our blood becomes thickened, the anti diuretic hormone reabsorbs more water from the kidneys and returns it to the blood.

We become thirsty and drink water to help restore the balance. Your kidneys conserve water before we get thirsty but when you do get thirsty you drink some water to replenish what was lost before you do get dehydrated.

We drink to keep our system balanced.

We have all been told that the color of our urine denotes dehydration and color in the urine means that you are getting dangerously dehydrated.

If the color of your urine is getting dark it is a signal that you need to replenish the water in your system.

The point is that you don't have to super saturate your self to keep your body working.

On very hot days when you are in the heat you need to keep aware of the need to replace the water in your system due to the loss of water from evaporation from sweat whether you think you sweat or not.

When you get thirsty drink something with water in it.

Some of these thoughts were taken from a nutrition magazine with an interview with a Dr. Heinz Valtin.

Chapter A Educator

What you always wanted to know about Nogales AZ and was afraid to ask.

Nogales is a city in Santa Cruz County, Arizona, United States. The population was 20,878 at the 2000 census. According to 2005 Census Bureau estimates, the population of the city is 20,833.[1] The city is the county seat of Santa Cruz County

Nogales, Arizona, borders the city of Nogales, Sonora, Mexico, and is Arizona's largest international border town. The southern terminus of Interstate 19 is located in Nogales at the U.S.-Mexico border; the highway continues south into Mexico as Mexico Federal Highway 15.

On November 21, 2007, Mayor Ignacio Barraza died at the age of 38. He was the second mayor to die in office. Having not appointed a vice-mayor, Nogales lacked a clear line of succession for the office of mayor and, as of January 2008, this position has recently been filled since Barraza's death.

Scenic Attractions: The county of Santa Cruz and the city of Nogales have 200 properties listed in the National Register of Historic Sites, including Tumacacori National Monument visited by Father Kino in 1691 and Tubac Presidio, established by the Spanish in 1752 on an Indian village site. Others include the Old Tubac Schoolhouse, Old Nogales City Hall, Santa Cruz County Courthouse, and

Patagonia Railroad Depot. The Patagonia-Sonoita Creek Sanctuary, 19 miles east, attracts worldwide visitors to see its diverse bird life. It is also host to ghost towns and mining camps, curio shops, first-class restaurants and night clubs. In 1917, Nogales was the site of the last engagement in the Indian Wars.

The Santa Cruz County Historical Courthouse on Morley Street/Court Street has the statue of Lady Justice on top of the building. Lady Justice is supposed to have a blindfold on holding the scales of justice. This symbolizes that justice is blind. The Nogales version of Lady Justice is not wearing a blindfold.

The name "Nogales" is derived from the Spanish word for "walnut" or "walnut tree." It refers to the large stands of walnut trees that once stood in the mountain pass where Nogales is located.

Nogales, Arizona, was the filming location for the motion picture version of the musical, Oklahoma! (1955). Nogales was chosen because it looked more like turn-of-the-century Oklahoma (when the musical is set) more than anywhere in Oklahoma did at that time. Oklahoma itself had apparently become far too developed by 1955. Nogales, Arizona, was made an "honorary" part of the state of Oklahoma for the duration of the film shoot by order of the governor of Arizona.

Nogales was also known as Isaacson. In 1880, Russian immigrant Jacob Isaacson built a trading post at present-day Nogales. The U.S. Postal Service opened the Isaacson Post Office but renamed it as Nogales in 1883.

A small part of William Gibson's The Gernsback Continuum short story refers to the city of Nogales.

Nogales is one of the only (if not the only) communities in the United States to operate school buses in city bus service.

These buses are privately owned and operated, and are not subject to any oversight. Because of this, in 2008, the city of Nogales will provide new vehicles that have air conditioning and are compliant with all regulations.

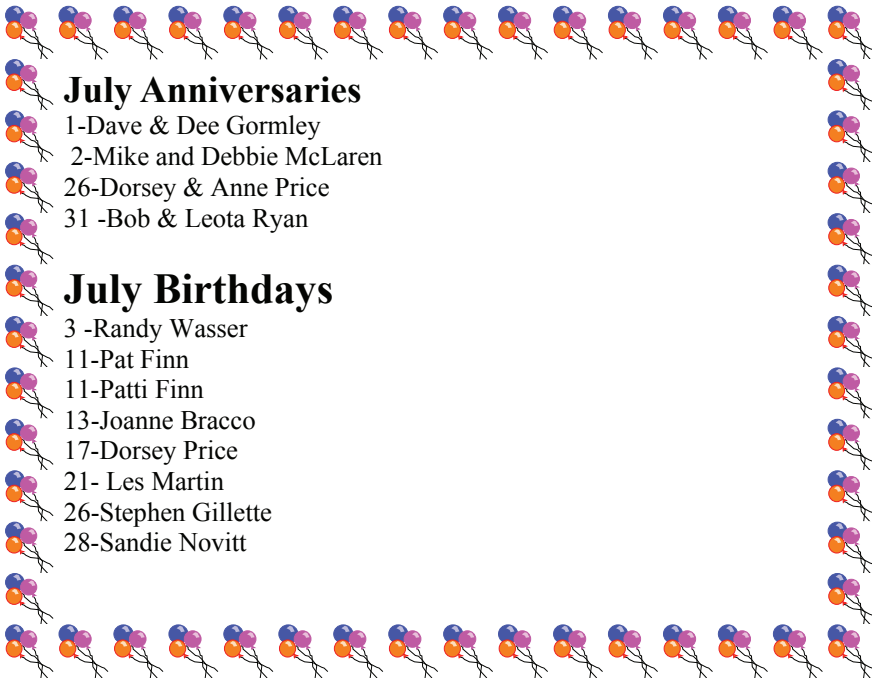

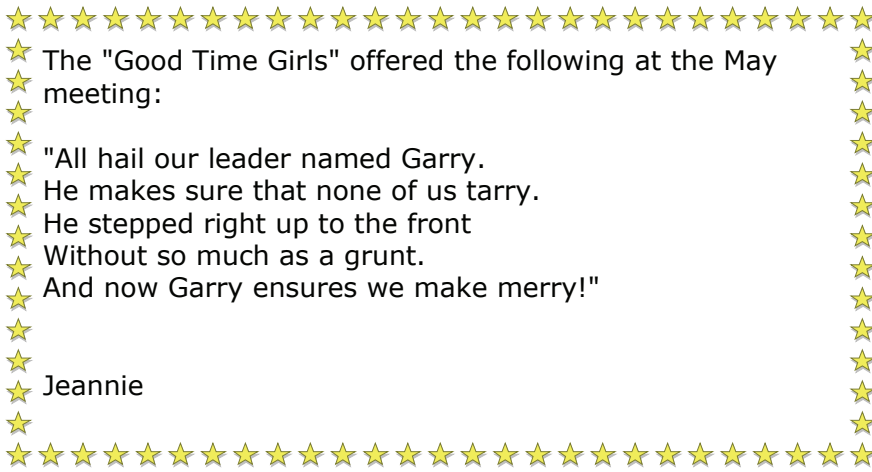

We have a few still pictures captured by some of the spectators watching the demonstration and they are available to you.

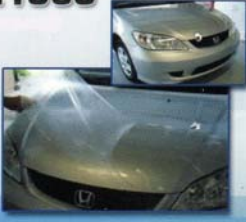
