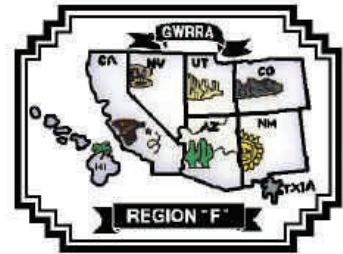

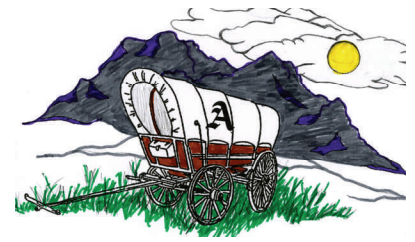

Getting to Know Your Chapter Staff - March 2010 Gene and Jeannie

McGaughey Gene bought his first bike in 1953, an olive drab Indian, which had been an Army bike that he had for only two weeks. In 1997 he bought a 1982 750 Verago - a "big" bike to learn to tour on - it's actually sitting in their garage! He bought his first Gold Wing in 2000, which is a white GL 1500, and has about 140,000 miles.

Their favorite scenic ride was their first long ride up to Big Sur, California coastline to Oregon and Vancouver Island, Lake Louise, Baniff and the infamous "Highway to the Sun." Their longest ride was their Nova Scotia trip of 10,600 miles. Their most exciting ride was down Broadway in New York City on 9/10/2008 on their red, white and blue motorcycle with a flag on the back. It was the day before the 9/11 remembrance parade so they were well photographed as they rode down Broadway photographing the big city!

Jeannie began a government career (15 years) as a secretary with the Park Rangers with Yellowstone National Park. After they were "let go" by President Regan, Gene opened a detective agency in Salt Lake called The Cheap Detectives. They retired out of Los Angeles after Gene spent a year as an x-pat working in Kazakhstan and moved to Green Valley in 2003. RIDING IN THE HEAT OF THE DESERT

DESERT, a noun, a region so arid that it only supports sparse vegetation or none at all.

With this definition in mind, living in Arizona causes some concerns when the desert heat increases. We begin to think nothing of 100 degrees temperatures. But, when it gets hotter, there are problems ahead for motorcycle riders. Riders not familiar with the extreme heat and motorcycle riding are in great danger of having a HEAT STROKE incident. They do not realize the danger they are putting themselves and their co-rider in. HEAT STROKE makes you weak, affects your muscular ability, vision and your mental capabilities. You simply can not make rational, quick decisions. You only want to get out of the heat and there is no where to go or stop. Its 50+ miles to anywhere or anything that will help.

There are times not to ride in the heat. That decision can be made before you get on the motorcycle. Remember, temperature readings are taken in the shade. 110 degrees is 20-30 degrees hotter in the direct sunlight. Think about the increasing temperatures during the ride. What will the temperature be in one, two or three hours from now? Is it going to get hotter or cooler? Is the sun coming up or going down? Select the cooler parts of the 24 hour day for long distance riding.

In addition to direct sun light, DEHYDRATION is a serious consideration. Most riders forget the effects of hot wind flowing over their bodies. This may feel cooler, but, it actually increases the dehydration of the body. The body must have fluids in it to maintain its normal cooling process. Drink lots of water.

But, if you get caught in the heat, here are some suggestions that may help you get to the next stop safely:

- Wear proper riding gear; long pants, long sleeve shirt (cotton), light weight leather gloves, sunglasses, sun screen on all exposed areas of skin.
- Wear that helmet. It keeps the sun from baking your head and helps you to perspire. This is the body's natural cooling system at work, Use it to your advantage. Wearing a "skull cap" is also cooler. It will absorb the perspiration and help keep your head cooler.
- Wear a water soaked bandanna or a "neck cooler" around your neck. This helps cool the blood going to the head.
- Wet your clothing. Wear a shirt the is dripping wet under a dry shirt or light jacket. This keeps the cool moisture next to your skin. The outer shirt or jacket will help slow the wet shirts evaporation.
- Drink lots of water and carry a gallon or more of water with you. Four 1 liter bottles are easy to pack
- Take frequent rest breaks in the shade or air conditioned buildings. Drink more water. Refill your water containers at each stop.
- Carry a spray bottle filled with water to wet your self down. This fine mist will feel very good on a hot day. A word of CAUTION: if your co-rider is spraying you while riding, your sunglasses, helmet visor and windshield will get water spotted. This reduces visibility. Make frequent stops to clean these. Ride safely. Be able) see where you are going.
- If you get caught in the heat and there is no shade. Find a safe place to park. Drape your motorcycle cover or extra clothing over the bike or tall bush to create some shade. Take a rest. Drink water. Do not leave until you feel safe to ride.
- If it is to hot to ride— DON'T. Heat stroke comes on very quickly. It can be deadly. Ride safely. Ride With-Pride and Confidence.
